Tools & Supplies

Macramé Board - I recommend a "Macramé Project Board" made by Pepperell Crafts (available at micro-macramejewelry.com). Leave the plastic on so the fibers don't shed on your clothes. Another good choice is an 11" X 17" unframed cork bulletin board. A temporary board can be made by gluing two pieces of foam core together (be careful of the pins poking through the back). Make sure that your board is tall enough to rest in your lap while leaning up against your desk.

Quilting Pins - Sturdy large sewing or quilting pins. Small size (1.25") T-pins are also good but the larger (1.75") size T-pins are too thick and will damage the cord.

Crewel Embroidery Needle - Size #2 or a similar medium size.

Scissors - Small and sharp for getting into tight places.

Clear Nail Polish - (optional on some projects) To secure finishing knots.

"Fray Check" - (optional) This is used to stiffen the end of the cord, making it easier to thread beads with small holes. Let it dry for 10 - 15 minutes for best results.

Video Class Materials

Macrame Cord - At least 10 yards of one or more of the following: 18 gauge Nylon (thinnest) or Tex 400 Nylon (thicker), Chinese Knotting Cord, Waxed Cotton, Waxed Linen, Macrame Twine, Soft Hemp, Satin Rattail, etc...

E-pattern Materials - Bookmark

Cord- 18g. Nylon Cord - 5 lengths @ 44" (S-Lon cord available at micro-macramejewelry.com).

Beads - (these beads were used in the sample bookmark, however, other beads may be substituted as long as they fit within the pattern)

- (1) 8 mm round (Crystal or Fire Polish)
- (5) 3 4 mm drop/fringe
- (2) 4 mm round antiqued gold or bronze
- (2) 4 mm round druk
- (14) 8° metallic bronze seeds
- (24+) 11° or 10° seeds (these will frame the 8 mm bead)
- (28+) 11° or 10° seeds (these will be at the outside edges)
