## Online Class - Fiber Bead Bracelet Materials List

### Tools & Supplies

**Macramé Board** - I recommend a "Macramé Project Board" made by Pepperell Crafts (available at [micro-macramejewelry.com](http://micro-macramejewelry.com)). Leave the plastic on so the fibers don't shed on your clothes. Another good choice is an 11" X 17" unframed cork bulletin board. A temporary board can be made by gluing two pieces of foam core together (be careful of the pins poking through the back). Make sure that your board is tall enough to rest in your lap while leaning up against your desk.

**Quilting Pins** - Sturdy large sewing or quilting pins. Small size (1.25") T-pins are also good but the larger (1.75") size T-pins are too thick and will damage the cord.

**Crewel Embroidery Needle** - Size #2 or a similar medium size.

**Scissors** - Small and sharp for getting into tight places.

### Video Class Materials

#### Cord & Thread:

- 18g Nylon Cord - 5 @ 32" ea. (Warps). S-Lon cord available at [micro-macramejewelry.com](http://micro-macramejewelry.com).
- Tex 400 cord: 1 @ 25" (Runner Cord). A doubled 50" length of 18g. may be substituted if Tex 400 is not available.
- (30") 4 - 6 lb. Fireline (or similar strong thread) for embellishing the fiber bead.
- (80") 6 - 8 lb. Fireline (or similar strong thread) for multistrand bracelet.

#### Beads:

- (60" - 70" strung) Size 11° seed beads (for multistrand bracelet)
- (54) Size 11° seed beads (for fiber bead)
- (9) 4 mm round beads
- (9) Size 8° seed beads

#### Findings:

- (2) 5 - 6 mm heavy duty jump rings
- (2) 7 - 8 mm closed rings (or split rings)
- Clasp (toggle, magnetic, or lobster, etc.)

#### Other:

- "Big Eye" or other long beading needle
- #10 "Sharps" beading needle
- Crewel embroidery needle size 2 (or similar)
- Chainnose Pliers
